Mission

Feeding Pets of the Homeless recognizes the vital bond between homeless individuals and their companion animals. We strive to preserve this connection by providing food and emergency veterinary care for pets of the homeless nationwide. By supporting these animals, we alleviate the anxiety of their owners, enabling them to better care for themselves and their loyal companions. Our mission is to nurture the human-animal bond, promote dignity, and offer hope to those experiencing homelessness.



PROGRAMS

- **Pet Food**

- donation sites (businesses) across the nation collect pet food that is delivered to pet food providers (food banks, soup kitchens, shelters, etc.) to distribute to pet families.

- **Emergency Veterinary Care**

- veterinary treatment for ill or injured pets belonging to people experiencing homelessness is available in all 50 US states.

- **Wellness Clinics**

- sponsorships available for veterinarians across the country to provide free clinics to low income & unhoused pet owners for basic wellness exams & vaccines. Vaccines help prevent the spread of diseases in the community.

- **Veteran Pet Support**

- assistance is provided to veterans who are experiencing homelessness as well as veterans participating in the HUD-VASH program who are housed & in VA treatment programs with veterinary care and pet food. Along with spay/neuter & vaccines to get into housing.

- **Crates**

- collapsible metal crates are supplied to homeless & domestic violence shelters so people & their pets are allowed in the building together. We believe this program helps connect those in need with a social worker & support resources.
